National Statistics

An estimated 3.5% of adults in the United States identify as lesbian, gay, or bisexual and an estimated 0.3% of adults are transgender. • This implies that there are approximately 9 million LGBT Americans, a figure roughly equivalent to the population of New Jersey.



U.S. Population = 323,000,000

LGBTQ Populaton = 11,375,000



The 2017 California population

- 39.54 million
- LGBTQ estimated population = 1,382,000



Placer County population approaching 400,000

LGB population using 4.5% as a mean = 18,000

Transgender population using .01% = 400

Queer and Questioning Adults and Youth are under reported



- From 2015 California Healthy Kids Survey (Placer County 7th, 9th, 11th grades):
 - **6% L**esbian, **G**ay, **B**isexual (604)
 - **1% T**ransgender (101)
 - **5% Q**uestioning or Unsure (503)
 - Totaling 11-12% LGBTQ (1107+)
- Overrepresented in the Homeless and Foster Population

- 2X More likely to experiment with <u>substances</u>
- 2X More likely to <u>self-harm</u> with each instance of physical and verbal harassment
- 44% of LGBT Youth identify as being <u>unhappy</u> compared to 36% of their non-LGBT peers

<u>Seriously Considered Attempting Suicide Rate</u>

Heterosexual Teen → 14.8%

Questioning/Unsure Teen → 31.9%

Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual Teen \rightarrow 42.8%

Youth Mental Wellness

Contacted all Placer County public middle and high schools and conducted interviews with:

14 High Schools

6 Middle Schools

4 Continuation Schools

7 Elementary Schools

Study's findings are based on the contact that was made and are not conclusive, but allowed a general feel for the school's culture and resources for LGBTQ+ students, as well as gaps that may exist


Recommendations




