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A Dabble in the Data

Recently, we have been getting questions about website traffic on the Network of Care. This month, we wanted to dedicate a bit space to give a very broad overview on traffic to the site. In 2011, roughly 350 individuals were visiting the Network of Care to find ways to improve their wellness. You may have noticed, the Placer County Network of Care has been working hard to get the word out about this great resource. As of January 2012, approximately 800 people are utilizing the many tools offered by the Network of Care *per day*. In other words, site traffic as more than doubled in the first quarter of 2012. Importantly, utilization of the Service Directory and Community Calendar have increased by 25% and 20%, respectively, in the first quarter of 2012. What does this all mean? Almost 1,000 people come to the Network of Care every day looking to improve their wellness, and connect with the great service providers listed on the Network of Care!

Placer Community Leaders Share Resources to Improve Services and Quality of Life for County Residents

The <u>Placer Collaborative Network</u> (PCN) convened health and human service organizations at the 2nd Annual Resource Sharing Meeting Thursday, April 19 in Roseville. Over 100 attendees representing 50 organizations shared materials, updated each other on current projects and discovered partnership opportunities to improve coordination of services to Placer County residents. Attendees also learned how to create or modify their Placer County Network of Care directory listings and even were able to live-update them on site!

The meeting was moderated by PCN co-chairs Janice LeRoux, Executive Director, First Five Placer and Maureen Bauman, Director, Placer County HHS Adult System of Care. The agenda included a moving performance by Kyle Lutkemuller of the <u>Auburn Hip Hop Congress</u>, demonstrating the importance and value of connecting story to a cause. Kyle created the original composition for a senior project to raise funds to prevent child abuse. In addition to the performance, the Resource Sharing Meeting included a presentation on the Placer County Network of Care website, and the <u>Give Local Now</u> Street Team spread the word about how organizations can be involved in the movement to increase philanthropy in the region. Attendees then spent over an hour networking in the display area.

Placer County First 5 Director Janice LeRoux had the following to say about the resource sharing meeting: "The Placer Collaborative Network is dedicated to providing opportunities to connect and collaborate among and between area agencies in order to better serve the health and human service needs of our citizens. The Resource Sharing Meeting was a real time demonstration of the power of dialogue and information sharing between organizations."

The Placer Collaborative Network is a unique organization that facilitates communitywide collaboration to address health and human services. PCN helps local agencies gain a better understanding of the services available, discover funding and partnering opportunities for projects, increase funding opportunities through collaborative relationships, and approach community issues with collaborative partners. The Nonprofit Resource Center provides administrative support for PCN.

What is Lighthouse Counseling and Family Resource Center? What is the main focus of Lighthouse FRC?

The Lighthouse Counseling and Family Resource Center is a free drop-in referral and information center for Placer County residents. We provide assistance to promote self reliance and self improvement. Lighthouse FRC services are provided in both English and Spanish.

Who does Lighthouse serve? What services do you provide?

Lighthouse serves Placer County residents. Available resources and referrals include: current job listings, career assessments, interview preparation, resume assistance, budgeting help, counseling, parenting information and resources, childcare services referrals, recreational opportunities, community activities, housing information and assistance with emergency basic needs (food, shelter, and utilities). The FRC also works with community and county partners to locate and provide one-time assistance with emergency vouchers for food, gas, lodging, and other needs (as funding allows).
